The Association believes that now is a good time to explore the role that religion plays and could or should play in the future, in our changing societies on the island.

In a time of increasing diversity, the development of multi-faith communities and increasing numbers who profess no faith, North and South, these matters have a particular relevance to the quality of relations on the island.

Our hope is that the conference will allow reflection on how religion can act as an agent for good in changing circumstances, on how faith communities and those without faith can contribute to public discourse and on what needs to change to ensure that cohesive communities can develop across the island of Ireland.
